But all readers will agree that *The Program* is a superior thriller; a novel firmly grounded in the realities of three-dimensional characters in crisis and driven with the narrative pace of a guilty pleasure.

Running away from an intolerable home situation, a 15-year-old boy finds that he has nowhere to go and no one to turn to.
